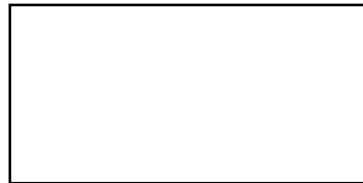


Pebble Hill, also known as the Scott-Yarbrough House, is a home built in 1847 in Auburn, Alabama. The land, the home, and the artifacts located inside the house illustrate the important lives of Creek Indians, enslaved persons, and founders and builders of the town of Auburn.
